WORLD ADAPTATION SCIENCE PROGRAMME

The United Nations' World Adaptation Science Programme (WASP) represents seven UN agencies: the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), the Green Climate Fund (GCF), the Global Environment Facility (GEF) and the United Nations University (UNU).

WASP's core vision is ensuring that climate adaptation knowledge gaps are filled. Its work focuses on policy-relevant science for decision-makers, and priority knowledge needs in vulnerable developing countries and communities. WASP seeks to bridge the climate adaptation knowledge gap with transformative, just and resilient action, evidence-based policies, and solutions.

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

Expected attendance

Adaptation Futures is organised every two years. Around 1,500 people attended the last Conference in Montreal Canada in 2023, while 1,300 gathered for Adaptation Futures in 2018.

Adaptation Futures 2025 will bring together over 1500 people spanning experts, policymakers and the business sector to share and explore cutting-edge issues in climate change adaptation.

One conference, available worldwide in hybrid format

Adaptation Futures 2025 walks the talk. As a climate community we are committed to a hybrid conference in Ōtautahi Christchurch, New Zealand and worldwide. The programme focuses on accelerating adaptation action with 180+ sessions involving more than 900 speakers. It is co-designed by experts from around the globe and features a complete takeover of Te Pae Christchurch Convention Centre, followed by a day of Living Labs including field experiences across the Canterbury region. The Conference is preceded by a talanoa (discussion) for early career scientists and a wānanga/welcome for indigenous peoples from around the world, both happening on 12 October.

Alongside the conference, an arts outreach programme and other public events will bring new climate adaptation ideas to the local community through a variety of accessible formats, including talks, exhibitions, and music and drama performances.

The fully integrated Conference will be delivered to a worldwide audience using OnAIR, a powerful hybrid and virtual solution, linked to EventsAIR. The technology will allow online participants to experience the Conference in carefully produced audio-visual productions, and enables the Conference to be interactive, ensuring speakers and participants can join from around the world, participate in presentations in real time, and connect with sponsors and exhibitors.
