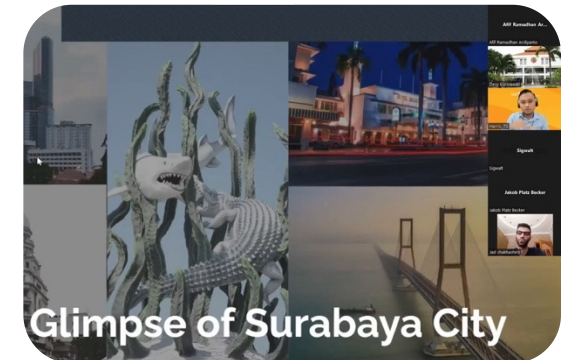
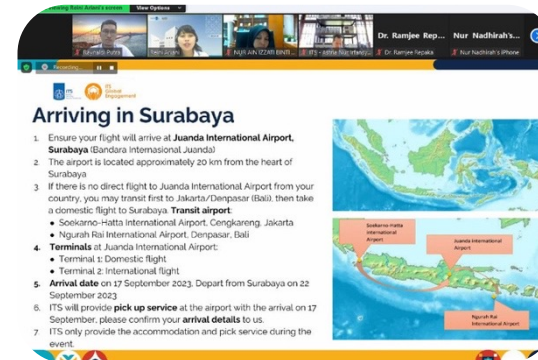
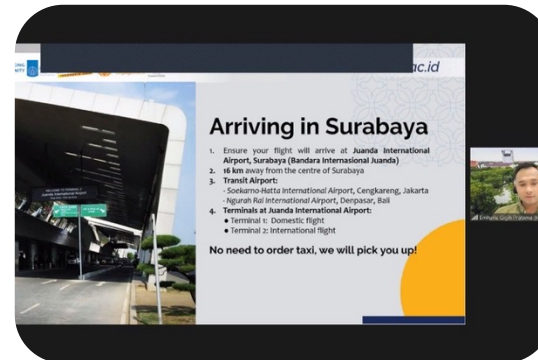
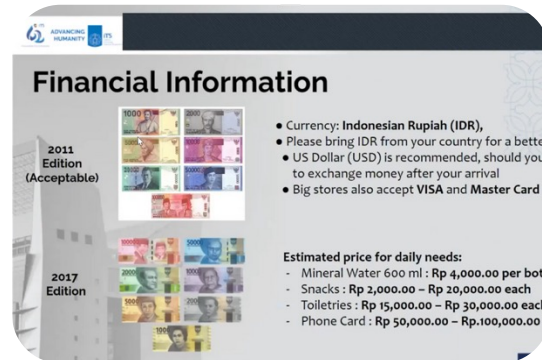
PDO

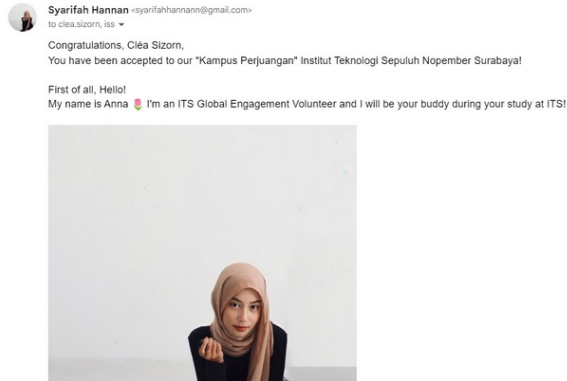

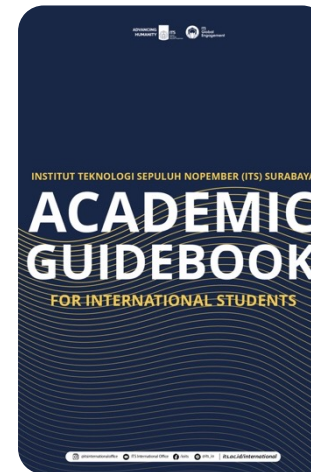

Study Mechanism

What is SKS?
SKS or Sistem Kredit Semester (Semester Credit System) is a system of implementation of education by using credit units of semester (credit system) to measure the quality of learning activities, learning objectives, and program implementation results.

Conversion to ECTS
The credit equivalence between SKS (Indonesia), semester, semester and ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) may refer to the following:

1 SKS = 1.7 ECTS

↳ to calculate SKS (convert SKS quantity per semester)

ECTS = SKS x 1.7

↳ to calculate SKS

SKS = 30 ECTS / 1.7

SKS = 18

ETS AND EAS

Midterm Evaluation (ETS)
Midterm Evaluation (ETS) is a learning evaluation system in the middle of the semester (usually in the 5th week of the semester). The requirement for students to take part in the Midterm Evaluation is to have an attendance of at least 50% of the total meetings.
Example: a course has a total of 18 meetings. Attendance must be 9 meetings or more (50%) for you to attend at least 12 meetings.

Final Evaluation (EAS)
Final Evaluation (EAS) is a learning evaluation system at the end of the semester (usually in the 10th week of the semester). The requirement for students to take part in the Final Evaluation is to have an attendance of at least 50% of the total meetings.
Example: a course has a total of 18 meetings. Attendance must be 9 meetings or more (50%) for you to attend at least 12 meetings.

Regulation

CLOTHING ATTIRE IN CAMPUS

Although Surabaya's weather is warm and humid, people of Surabaya are accustomed to wear modest and clean clothes. You may be prohibited to attend classes or attend off-campus due to wearing improper clothes. However, there is no specific uniform to wear in ITS.

Dress codes of ITS students, including international students, to attend classes, to meet with lecturers, and to visit ITS Global Engagement office or other units/depts are collar and sleeve short-sleeved, long trousers, or over-knee skirt/dress (for female students).

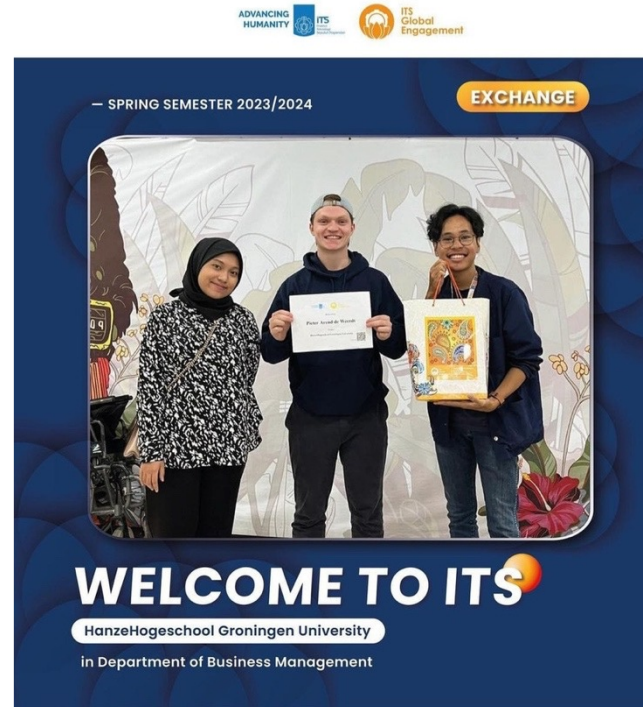

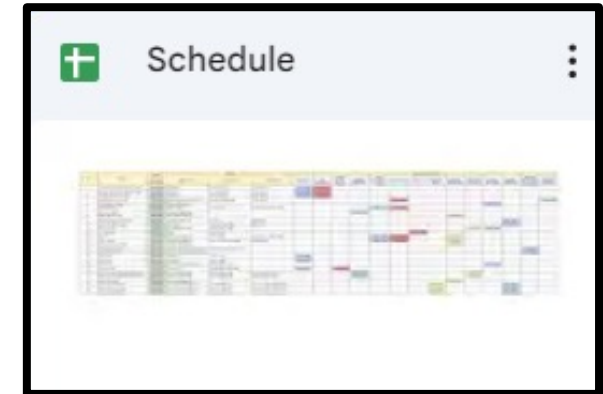

We scheduled meeting with each department with the international students to make sure the courses that they will take in ITS is suitable with their goal.



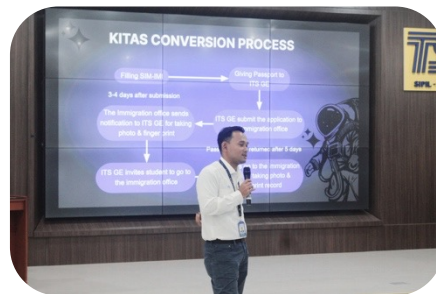

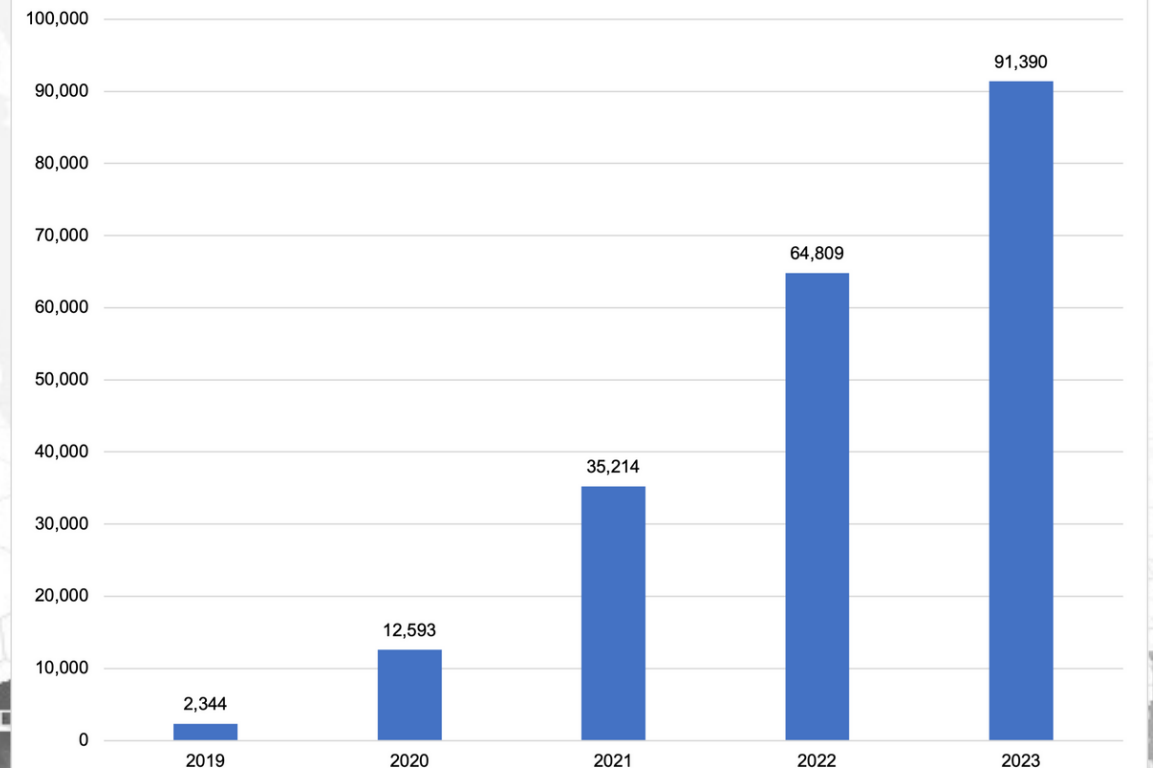
