- Global associations are networks serving global higher education with memberships by universities.
- Act as the voice for higher education that shares a global vision, values and commitment.
- Provide a platform for leaders of institutions to plan actions on common priorities.
- Create opportunities (eg. research grants) and events that enable members to network.
- Benefit faculty, academic staff, students and support staff.
- Universiti Malaya is a member of several global networks under the International Relations Office (IRC).
- Supported by the Strategic Global Alliances Division, a newly formed division under IRC.
