

Framework

Community Colleges - Critical Pathway

- 44% of all undergraduate students study at a community college
- 47% who graduated with 4-year degree had attended a community college
- Traditional 18-24 year olds, working adults, part-time students, etc.

Our Approach

As a two-year college that's part of a Research I institution, we have a unique opportunity and a mission to affect change.

- Free Passport Initiative
- Creative Offerings (goal: all continents in '25)
- Provide Study Abroad Scholarships
 - Int'l Education Fee (\$1,000)
 - Int'l Access Scholarship (up to \$2,500)
 - ATLAS Scholarship (\$1,000)
- Count SA as In-State Tuition Eligible
- Recruit Students of Color (AAMI/IDEAS Grant)
- Study Abroad Ambassadors
- Offer Alternatives (VE and VSA)









Highlights



87.21% of students who studied abroad did so on a GSU faculty-led program.




751 students studied abroad in **38** different countries



53.96% of study abroad participants were students of color

 - 12 graduate students
- Free Passport Program: 181 free passports awarded!
- Total Amount of GSU Study Abroad Scholarships Awarded:
- 1,450,487.00

- Total amount awarded for 2022 2023:: \$127,500







Overcoming Challenges for Great Outcomes

Increased # of Students with

In 2021, we had excess lunds since SAPs were not running, so we launched a new program to fund first-time passport ownership, the Free Passport Program.

- Awarded over 1,000 Free Passports in the first year and have continued offering them.
- Have a Passport Office on Campus
- New partnership with Delta Airlines to continue

Increased Engagement in Int'l

Education

We've steadily worked to increase VE participation. In the past two years, we've had a 31% increase in participation, with 216 students engaged in VE in Fall 2023.

Increased #s of Students Becoming Global

Scholars

We designed a recognition/certificate program that allows students to earn a badge for successfully completing coursework in a series of classes that have a "global" component. Since launch in Fall 2022, over 300 students have earned the badge.
