

- Living-learning campus poised to become largest residential campus in the country by 2026.
- 2nd most applied to university in the country (200k/ year).
- \$1.76 billion research enterprise (2023).
- U.S. News and World Report 20th Global, 5th best public in U.S.; 19th in Academic Ranking of World Universities.
- The 2023 Highly Cited Researchers list includes 71 faculty distinctions from UC San Diego the highest number of influential voices in the UC system and ranks 7th highest among universities worldwide.






Research Ecosystem

Compact agreements



- **Reciprocal** seed funding to facilitate and support joint initiatives with priority partners
- Teams which include PhD or masters by research students, postdocs, earlyand mid-career researchers, and researchers on Sabbatical Leave
- Multidisciplinary
- Sustainable projects i.e., **able to leverage external funding**
- Projects address SDGs
- Develop **multi-year contract** between our global partners and our multidsicplinary institutes for academic staff to **engage in collaborative research** on nominated SDGs i.e climate action etc
- Further funding is dependent on meeting milestones
- Funding criteria includes **leveraging external funding** above 250,000

Supporting SDG collaborations through internal grants

SDG Collaboration awards



- Funding of 150,000 per project to support collaborative initiatives that develop multi-disciplinary cutting-edge research to create which addresses the SDGs
- Preference is for international partners which are University strategic partner universities or network partners.
- Multidisciplinary
- Sustainable projects i.e., able to leverage external funding
 - Successful USyd teams are expected to **submit external grant applications** (to the value of AUD 300,000) within 18 months.
- Projects must address **SDGs and teams are encouraged to use the** impact tracker

Indian Institute of Technology, Madras partnership

- Sydney and IIT Madras have signed a strategic partnership under the broad theme of 'Energy'
- Both Institutions committed **50,000 a year** over 3 years to seed fund projects.
- The Consortium will be a **research hub** for researchers conducting collaborative projects in fields related to energy
- Facilitate academic mobility with an emphasis on HDR students and early career researchers
- Facilitate joint conferences, meetings, and/or workshops on the Research Themes.
- Facilitate participation to large research funding calls
- Facilitate a **visiting Fellowship** program
- Identify complementarity of labs, develop sister labs
- Next steps
- Joint Ph.D. agreement
- Virtual research centre on 'Energy'





Tripartite agreement – Fudan & University of Hong Kong

- Signed our **first tripartite agreement** focussed on the SDGs
- Sustainability and carbon neutrality initiatives in the Asia Pacific Region
- Establish a **joint research hub** on sustainability and neutrality initiatives
- **Developing** university wide carbon neutrality targets in advancing research and educational programs in the Asia Pacific Region



Network engagement

- Members of **3 university networks** that aim to contribute to the SDG framework for global cooperation to address the world's 'wicked' challenges through:
- Research
- Student experience
- Advocacy
- Educational innovation







Student experiential learning

- We partner with industry to provide opportunities for our students through Industry and project community units (ICPUs).



- In collaboration with an industry partner and an academic lead, students work in a group with other students from a range of disciplinary backgrounds on projects addressing the SDGs.





- Faculty Participation in SDG Events and Activities








