



Ministerial Regulation 53 of 2018, Indonesia

Situation

• In 2018 the regulatory landscape in Indonesia's higher education sector prevented international institutions from establishing branch campuses in the country.

Action

- Engaged RISTEK DIKTI early in their discussions and development of the Indonesian education internationalisation strategy
- Consulted with the Australian sector on draft campus regulations
- Negotiated to reduce barriers by highlighting examples of other countries' approaches to welcoming foreign university campuses

Result

- A set of regulations that are sufficiently attractive to Australian universities while also meeting Indonesia's national development objectives.
- Upon commencement of these regulations, foreign-owner campuses could be established in Indonesia
- Monash University opened the first stand-alone foreign-owned campus in Indonesia
