



Program structure at **TCU**

- 2-year program
- April 2024 apply & enter program
- May 2024-December 2024 English prep course (6 classes a week) + pre-departure orientation
- February 2025 Cycle A departs
- May 2025 Cycle A returns to Japan
- August 2025 Cycle B departs
- November 2025 Cycle B returns to Japan

- What it's like in Perth/Australia
- Getting a passport/visa
- What to bring
- Safety
- Small group discussion with TAP returnee students
- Scholarship conferment
- Culture shock
- Making the most of the prep course






Expectations for students

- Satisfactorily complete 80% of the pre-departure program
- Be able to learn, think and share their opinion in English
- Add up to 100 points to their TOEIC score before departure + 100 points post-program

Student feedback (August 2023 program)

- 88% of students are satisfied or very satisfied with their program
- 84% of students said they grew through their experience in TAP
- 84% of students reported their buddy was a good friend to them
